

Cantastic Rules

1. All teams are responsible for acquiring or purchasing the cans of food to make their sculpture.
2. Sculptures must fit in a 10'x10' area, and be no taller than 8 feet.
3. For safety issues, a maximum of 5 people are permitted at one time to work in the designated 10'x10' area. You may have additional team members working outside of the area during the build. Team members working in the building area may be changed out during the build as long as no more than 5 people are in the design area at one time. There is no limit on the number of people involved in the planning, logistics and design.
4. All teams must submit the title of their sculpture, written description, design concept, dimensions, and a detailed list of foods and cans used.
5. The sculptures must be made of unopened canned food with the labels still intact, and contain minimal elements of nonperishable packaged food or props.
6. Sculptures must be self-supporting. No framework or other support may be used. Sheets of Plexiglas, foam core, cardboard or other similar material can be used as a leveling device between rows as long as they are no thicker than 1/4" each.
7. Cans can be joined by tape, Velcro, fishing string, wire, rubber bands or any other method that provides easy demolition. If you are planning on using one or more of those items, remember that the labels and cans **MUST NOT** be damaged.
8. No alcohol, glass containers, pet food, perishable items or opened food allowed!
